#### Revelation: What Does This Mean For Us?

You are invited to join the adult Sunday School class as it continues a study on the book of Revelation. No prior experience or knowledge is required - simply bring a curious mind and a desire to know more about this last book of the Bible. The class meets in the Bethlehem room following worship.

- 10/5 We'll discuss how the world might end, and we'll look into various end-time predictions and preparations Christians have made throughout history and up to the present day. ## Greetings from Pastor Mark:

Happy news! Phase 2 begins

God's beloved people: Phase 2 of the interim process begins this month. This is the ground zero of the whole interim process we are currently journey together in. This is the phase in which the great and holy people of King of Gloria Lutheran Church will gather into "listening session small groups".

These are formal small groups that are very different in many aspects. Some things that these groups are not: they will not be "buzz groups", back-and-forth, discussion debating and planning for the future, point counterpoint, "taste great less filling", and so forth . Rather these are sharing and listening groups.

We will gather in small groups, with the target numbers for each group being no less than six participants (to help ensure a critical mass) and no more than 12 maximum. I stress maximum, because more than 12 people in a group usually ends up with the introverts shutting down and the rockstar extroverts taking over. That's not what these groups are about! These are firm numbers that I will insist on being adhered to for a best small group dynamics and for the best use of each meeting time (90 minutes) to ensure maximum participation of all the group members.

Rather, these are sharing and listening groups. Each participant will have a chance to respond to the following questions:

- What makes your heart sing about King of Glory Lutheran Church?
- What are the challenges and opportunities that face our congregation in the next chapter of ministry?
- What are the mission or guiding goals you sent God calling King of blurry to embrace that will define the next chapter of mission and ministry?
- What what do we need to change about how we "do church" so that these goals hit the ground running?
- What are the gifts for ministry (Not personal qualities) The next called Pastor needs to bring to help King Of Glory Lutheran Church mission goals?

Every group participant will have the opportunity to respond to each of these questions. When one person is responding to a question, everybody else respectfully and quietly listens. There will not be any behaviors, i.e., interjecting, interruptive, finishing people sentences, challenging, or argumentative behaviors allowed when somebody is responding to the questions. The reason is, as God told Moses from a burning bush, "take off your sandals, Moses, because you are standing on holy ground (Exodus 3:5)". In these groups, we are standing on the holy ground of your fellow participants hopes, excitement, fears, dreams, uncertainty, anxiety, and purposes for our congregation's mission and ministry. Please respect that "holy ground" and patiently and respectfully listen as each of your group members are responding to the questions.

When each person has had the opportunity to respond to each of the questions, and if there is any time left over, then participants will be given a chance to add onto their responses. Once again, this is not the time for "give-and-take ", "Back-and-forth", "point counterpoint, etc. I realize that this can be a challenging task because we all want to share, we all want to interact with each other, and I notice already that you are a very engaging and interactive bunch of folks, and you love doing that with each other!

Please respectfully allow this process to happen in each of the groups as outlined, and good things will happen.

These groups will be led by teams of two people, one a facilitator, the other a scribe, who will record all the responses, no names attached, on newsprint, and at the end of each group meeting the teams will turn into the news print with the responses, and I will begin recording them as they are under each question.

There will be further steps and you may review those in the PowerPoint presentation that I presented August 24 that is also available on our media for your review.

I am writing to ask you, as people identified, who are good with small group processes, if you will prayerfully consider being Listening Session Small Group Facilitators and scribes? I will be training a group of folks, October 7, who will be facilitating these small groups. I was delighted to discover that groups have already been organized and are basically ready to go. I am thankful to our leadership who took the initiative to organize and structure these groups are ready that are basically ready to go and in place.

After I meet and train with you, you will pair up in teams, and then announce and post the dates, times, and location of their group meetings. I strongly encourage that these groups happen off campus, homes, pubs, coffee shops, restaurants, as these settings will lend themselves to a more relaxing "homey" atmosphere to the meetings.

Thank you for your prayerful consideration and I will look forward to our time together, 6-8:00 PM at KOG (unless one of you wishes to host this gathering in your home?) Pizza and drinks will be provided (no anchovy toppings, please!!)

Thank you for all you do, and the peace of Christ to be with you always.







#### What is it?

The Biblical Narrative portion (Part 1 - 16 units) is the first half of a 30 unit panoramic survey of the biblical narrative and biblical basis of core Christian teaching. Authored by the Reverend Dr. Harry Wendt, an Australian Lutheran pastor, and former founder and president of Crossways International (not to be confused with "Crossway", a totally unrelated organization!), these course materials have been use crossdenominationally around the world since their inception in the late 1980s.

#### Why?

- 1. To offer a survey experience that will take us through the big picture and major themes of the Hebrew and Christian scriptures, and also help us to see their unity as one great and grand narrative.
- 2. As an example of adult faith formation that can be offered in congregations as a much-needed complement to the three-year lectionary.
- 3. As a tool, during our discernment process towards God's mission goals for King of Glory's next chapter of ministry, to the engage with God's agenda, God's dreams, and God's mission goals for the world via the biblical narrative, that will help inform King of Glory's mission goals for the next chapter of ministry.



Dear God, be our guide for each new day and each change in our lives. Amen












#### Hear our prayer
