KIDS MESSAGE and Procession of Palms

Mark 11:1-11 *(Read by Assisting Minister)*

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples ² and said to them, “Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. ³ If anyone says to you, ‘Why are you doing this?’ just say this: ‘The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately.’” ⁴ They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, ⁵ some of the bystanders said to them, “What are you doing, untying the colt?” ⁶ They told them what Jesus had said, and they allowed them to take it. ⁷ Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it, and he sat on it. ⁸ Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. ⁹ Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, “Hosanna!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!

¹⁰ Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David!

Hosanna in the highest heaven!” ¹¹ Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple, and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

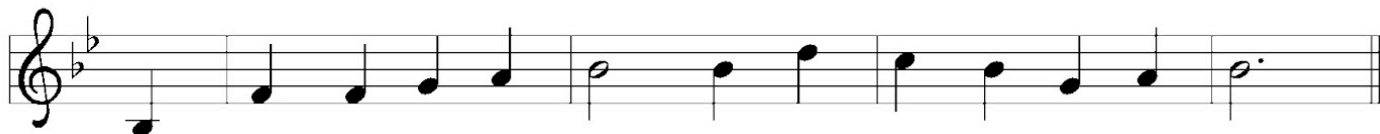

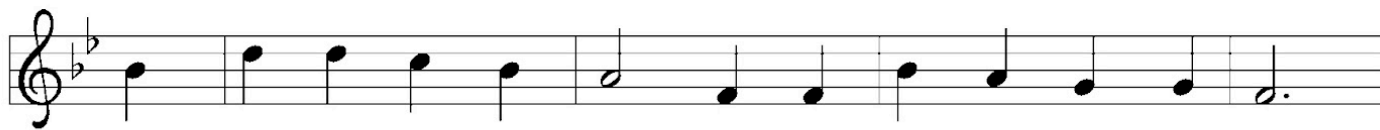

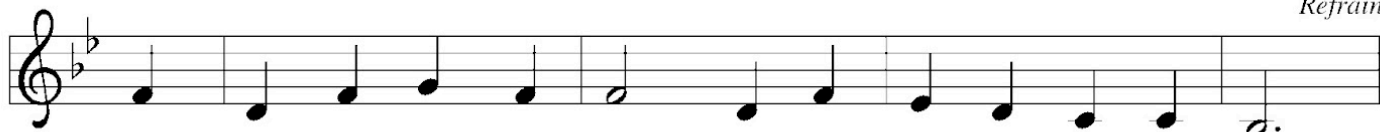

When they got there, he told them,**Abigail Spencer:** "Sit here while I go over there and pray."**Pastor Mark,** ³⁷ Jesus took along Peter and the two brothers, James and John. He was very sad and troubled, ³⁸ and he said to them,**Abigail Spencer:** "I am so sad that I feel as if I am dying. Stay here and keep awake with me."**Pastor Mark,** ³⁹ Jesus walked on a little way. Then he knelt with his face to the ground and prayed,**Abigail Spencer:** "My Father, if it is possible, don't make me suffer by drinking from this cup. But do what you want, and not what I want."**Pastor Mark,** ⁴⁰ He came back and found his disciples sleeping. So he said to Peter,**Abigail Spencer:** "Can't any of you stay awake with me for just one hour? ⁴¹ Stay awake and pray that you won't be tested. You want to do what is right, but you are weak."

Pastor Mark, ⁴² Again Jesus went to pray and said,

Abigail Spencer: “My Father, if there is no other way, and I must suffer, I will still do what you want.”

Pastor Mark, ⁴³ Jesus came back and found them sleeping again. They simply could not keep their eyes open. ⁴⁴ He left them and prayed the same prayer once more. ⁴⁵ Finally, Jesus returned to his disciples and said,

Abigail Spencer: “Are you still sleeping and resting? The time has come for the Son of Man to be handed over to sinners. ⁴⁶ Get up! Let's go. The one who will betray me is already here.”

Pastor Mark, ⁴⁷ Jesus was still speaking, when Judas the betrayer came up. He was one of the twelve disciples, and a large mob armed with swords and clubs was with him. They had been sent by the chief priests and the nation's leaders. ⁴⁸ Judas had told them ahead of time,

Shirley Engerbretson: “Arrest the man I greet with a kiss.”

Pastor Mark, ⁴⁹ Judas walked right up to Jesus and said,

Shirley Engerbretson: “Hello, teacher.”

Pastor Mark, Then Judas kissed him. ⁵⁰ Jesus replied,

Abigail Spencer: “My friend, do what you came for.”

Pastor Mark, The men grabbed Jesus and arrested him. ⁵¹ One of Jesus' followers pulled out a sword. He struck the servant of the high priest and cut off his ear.

Abigail Spencer: “Put your sword away. Anyone who lives by fighting will die by fighting. ⁵³ Don't you know that I could ask my Father, and he would at once send me more than twelve armies of angels? ⁵⁴ But then, how could the words of the Scriptures come true, which say this must happen?”

Pastor Mark, ⁵⁵ Jesus said to the mob,

Abigail Spencer: “Why do you come with swords and clubs to arrest me like a criminal? Day after day I sat and taught in the temple, and you didn't arrest me. ⁵⁶ But all this happened, so that what the prophets wrote would come true.”

Pastor Mark, All Jesus' disciples left him and ran away. ⁵⁷ After Jesus had been arrested, he was led off to the house of Caiaphas the high priest. The nation's leaders and the teachers of the Law of Moses were meeting there. ⁵⁸ But Peter followed along at a distance and came to the courtyard of the high priest's palace. He went in and sat down with the guards to see what was going to happen. ⁵⁹ The chief priests and the whole council wanted to put Jesus to death. So they tried to find some people who would tell lies about him in court. ⁶⁰ But they could not find

any, even though many did come and tell lies. At last, two men came forward ⁶¹ and said,

Marty Palmer, *“This man claimed he could tear down God's temple and build it again in three days.”*

Pastor Mark, ⁶² The high priest stood up and asked Jesus,

Becky Newberry: *“Why don't you say something in your own defense? Don't you hear the charges they are making against you?”*

Pastor Mark, ⁶³ But Jesus did not answer. So the high priest said,

Becky Newberry: *“With the living God looking on, you must tell the truth. Are you the Messiah, the Son of God?”*

Abigail Spencer: That is what you say!” “But I tell all of you, ‘Soon you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right side of God All-Powerful and coming on the clouds of heaven.’ ”

Pastor Mark, ⁶⁵ The high priest then tore his robe and said,

Becky Newberry: *“This man claims to be God! We don't need any more witnesses! You have heard what he said. ⁶⁶ What do you think?”*

Marty Palmer, *“He is guilty and deserves to die!”*

Pastor Mark, ⁶⁷ Then they spit in his face and hit him with their fists. Others slapped him ⁶⁸ and said,

Marty Palmer, *“You think you are the Messiah! So tell us who hit you!”*

Pastor Mark, ⁶⁹ While Peter was sitting out in the courtyard, a servant girl came up to him and said,

Patty Larson: “You were with Jesus from Galilee.”

Pastor Mark, ⁷⁰ But in front of everyone Peter said,

Ian Tompkins: “That isn't so! I don't know what you are talking about!”

Pastor Mark, ⁷¹ When Peter had gone out to the gate, another servant girl saw him and said to some people there,

Patty Larson: “This man was with Jesus from Nazareth.”

Pastor Mark, ⁷² Again Peter denied it, and this time he swore,

Ian Tompkins: “I don't even know that man!”

Pastor Mark, ⁷³ A little while later some people standing there walked over to Peter and said,

Patty Larson: “We know you are one of them. We can tell it because you talk like someone from Galilee.”

Pastor Mark, ⁷⁴ Peter began to curse and swear,

Ian Tompkins: “I don't know that man!”

Pastor Mark, Right then a rooster crowed, ⁷⁵ and Peter remembered that Jesus had said,

Abigail Spencer: “Before a rooster crows, you will say three times you don't know me.”

Pastor Mark, Then Peter went out and cried bitterly.

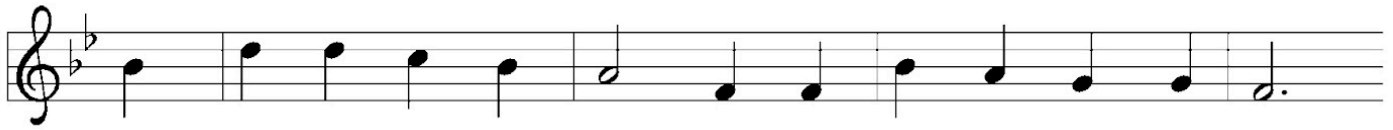

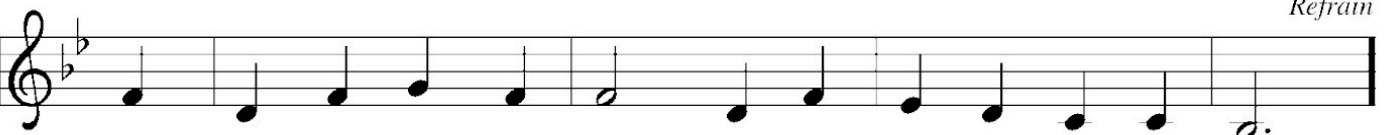

Pastor Mark,²⁷ Early the next morning all the chief priests and the nation's leaders met and decided that Jesus should be put to death.² They tied him up and led him away to Pilate the governor.³ Judas had betrayed Jesus, but when he learned that Jesus had been sentenced to death, he was sorry for what he had done. He returned the 30 silver coins to the chief priests and leaders⁴ and said

Shirley Engerbretson: I have sinned by betraying a man who has never done anything wrong."

Sue Fornander: "So what? That's your problem,"

Pastor Mark,⁵ Judas threw the money into the temple and then went out and hanged himself.⁶ The chief priests picked up the money and said

Sue Fornander: "This money was paid to have a man killed. We can't put it in the temple treasury."

Pastor Mark,⁷ Then they had a meeting and decided to buy a field that belonged to someone who made clay pots. They wanted to use it as a graveyard for foreigners.⁸ This is why people still call that place "Field of Blood."⁹ So the words of the prophet Jeremiah came true,

Sharon Grove: "They took the thirty silver coins, the price of a person among the people of Israel.¹⁰ They paid it for a potter's field, as the Lord had commanded me."

Pastor Mark,¹¹ Jesus was brought before Pilate the governor, who asked him,

Heidi Gainan: "Are you the king of the Jews?"

Abigail Spencer: "Those are your words!

Pastor Mark," Jesus answered.¹² And when the chief priests and leaders brought their charges against him, he did not say a thing.

¹³ Pilate asked him,

Heidi Gainan: "Don't you hear what crimes they say you have done?"

Pastor Mark,¹⁴ But Jesus did not say anything, and the governor was greatly amazed.¹⁵ During Passover the governor always freed a prisoner chosen by the people.¹⁶ At that time a well-known terrorist named Jesus Barabbas was in jail.¹⁷ So when the crowd came together, Pilate asked them,

Heidi Gainan: “Which prisoner do you want me to set free? Do you want Jesus Barabbas or Jesus who is called the Messiah?”

Coletta Hill: Pilate knew the leaders had brought Jesus to him because they were jealous. ¹⁹ While Pilate was judging the case, his wife sent him a message. It said,

Lyman Larson: “Don't have anything to do with that innocent man. I have had nightmares because of him.”

Coletta Hill: But the chief priests and the leaders convinced the crowds to ask for Barabbas to be set free and for Jesus to be killed. 21 Pilate asked the crowd again,

Heidi Gainan: “Which of these two men do you want me to set free?”

Pastor Mark, The crowd shouted “**Barabbas!**”

Heidi Gainan: What am I to do with Jesus, who is called the Messiah?”

Pastor Mark, They all yelled, “**Nail him to a cross!**”

Heidi Gainan: “But what crime has he done?”

Pastor Mark: they yelled even louder, “**Nail him to a cross!**”

Pastor Mark, ²⁴ Pilate saw that there was nothing he could do and that the people were starting to riot. So he took some water and washed his hands in front of them and said,

Heidi Gainan: “I won't have anything to do with killing this man. You are the ones doing it!”

Pastor Mark, ¹²⁵ Everyone answered, “ **We and our own families will take the blame for his death!**”

Coletta Hill: Pilate set Barabbas free. Then he ordered his soldiers to beat Jesus with a whip and nail him to a cross.

Exiting in Silence after the Final Reading

Final Scripture Reading:**Matthew 27:27-54****Pastor Mark,:** Narrator**Nicki Tompkins,** Third Narrator
(lectern)**Abigail Spencer:** Jesus**Mary Rickerd** Second Narrator
(lectern)**Lois Wisner:** Soldiers(handheld)

Mary Rickerd ²⁷ The governor's soldiers led Jesus into the fortress and brought together the rest of the troops. ²⁸ They stripped off Jesus' clothes and put a scarlet robe on him. ²⁹ They made a crown out of thorn branches and placed it on his head, and they put a stick in his right hand. The soldiers knelt down and pretended to worship him. They made fun of him and shouted,

Lois Wisner: "Hey, you king of the Jews!"

³⁰ Then they spit on him. They took the stick from him and beat him on the head with it. ³¹ When the soldiers had finished making fun of Jesus, they took off the robe. They put his own clothes back on him and led him off to be nailed to a cross.

³² On the way they met a man named Simon who was from Cyrene, and they forced him to carry Jesus' cross.

Nicki Tompkins, ³³ They came to a place named Golgotha, which means "Place of a Skull." ³⁴ There they gave Jesus some wine mixed with a drug to ease the pain. But when Jesus tasted what it was, he refused to drink it. ³⁵ The soldiers nailed Jesus to a cross and gambled to see who would get his clothes. ³⁶ Then they sat down to guard him. ³⁷ Above his head they put a sign that told why he was nailed there. It read,

Lois Wisner: "This is Jesus, the King of the Jews."

³⁸ The soldiers also nailed two criminals on crosses, one to the right of Jesus and the other to his left.

Pastor Mark,: People who passed by said terrible things about Jesus. They shook their heads and ⁴⁰ shouted,

"So you're the one who claimed you could tear down the temple and build it again in three days! If you are God's Son, save yourself and come down from the cross!"

Mary Rickerd ⁴¹ The chief priests, the leaders, and the teachers of the Law of Moses also made fun of Jesus. They said,

⁴² **"He saved others, but he can't save himself. If he is the king of Israel, he should come down from the cross! Then we will believe him.**

Nicki Tompkins He trusted God, so let God save him, if he wants to. He even said he was God's Son." ⁴⁴ The two criminals also said cruel things to Jesus.

⁴⁵ At noon the sky turned dark and stayed that way until three o'clock. ⁴⁶ Then about that time Jesus shouted,

Abigail Spencer: “Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?” which means, “My God, my God, why have you deserted me?”

Mary Rickerd ⁴⁷ Some of the people standing there heard Jesus and said, “He's calling for Elijah.” One of them at once ran and grabbed a sponge. He soaked it in wine, then put it on a stick and held it up to Jesus. ⁴⁹ Others said,

Congregation: “Wait! Let's see if Elijah will come and save him.”

Pastor Mark, ⁵⁰ Once again Jesus shouted, and then he died.

⁵¹ At once the curtain in the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. The earth shook, and rocks split apart. ⁵² Graves opened, and many of God's people were raised to life. ⁵³ They left their graves, and after Jesus had risen to life, they went into the holy city, where they were seen by many people. ⁵⁴ The officer and the soldiers guarding Jesus felt the earthquake and saw everything else that happened.
