Peas, please!

Well, as usual, our little plots are bursting with new pea plants! There may be one or two out there that are growing beans, but peas seem to be the stars of the show.

The sprinklers are on now, so things are really starting to take off.

New, deluxe pathways

When I had asked about using weed block in the pathways of our garden, the curator of a nearby community garden had told me that any weeds in the pathways tend to just get trampled, so are not generally a problem. So last year I did not lay down any weed block in the pathways. I dreaded dragging the heavy stuff out of the shed. I still laugh when I think about how naïve I was! It wasn't the weeds I should have been worried about. It was the fact that to many of our gardeners, any tiny speck of bare ground is fair game for cultivation. As the year progressed, I chuckled as I watched the pathways shrink, day by day, as they were filled with tiny, hopeful pea plants and m'chicha. By fall, the pathways were just tiny little deer trails through the wilderness.

This year you may notice that our pathways are now covered in carpeting, thanks to my next door neighbor replacing all the carpeting in his house. The installer thoughtfully cut it into 3 ft strips for me, rolled it up and even delivered it to my garage! This is a well-known garden "hack", as carpet, even in the toughest conditions, will last years and years. I anticipate being able to get a wheel barrow down the pathways all summer!

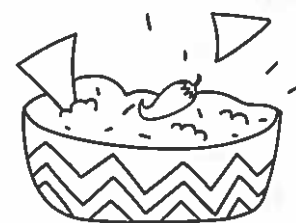

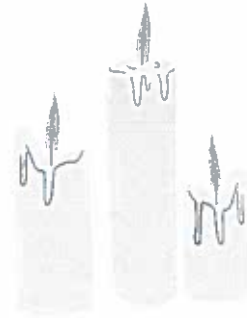

COUNCIL NEWS

Thank you for your continued faithful financial support of the ministries of King of Glory.

Your congregation council met May 11 for its regularly scheduled meeting. These are the approved action items:

·Received from the Worship Committee, approved the proposed summer worship schedule May 29-September 4: 9:30 AM.

·For the past two years, "pandemic protocol behavior," has been on the Council agenda!

At our April meeting we discussed loosening our behavior policies requiring masks and vaccinations. We surveyed you, the congregation, with an electronic/paper survey to assist in making our decision. The results of the survey:

13 requested masks continue to be required at worship and in-person events.

63 requested that masks be welcome but not required for worship and in-person events; masks should be worn based on personal preference or health requirements.

16 favored mask mandates at one of our worship services.

60 did not favor mask mandates at one of our worship services.

By a unanimous Council vote, it was approved that based on the "Low" Community Level in Ada County, masks will be welcome, or optional, and vaccinations will be encouraged but not required to attend worship services and in-person functions at King of Glory. Members who are ill (Covid or otherwise) should stay home. On-line services will continue to be available for those unable to attend in-person. IF the Community Level rises, mask requirements may again be reinstated.

This new pandemic protocol began May 29, with the start of the summer worship schedule.

Not an approved item but by unanimous enthusiasm to be able to make "real" summer fellowship plans, it was decided to set aside the Third Wednesday Evenings of June, July and August to get together for food, projects, time of worship and fellowship in King of Glory's back yard! There will be simple, organized activities for all ages. Mark the evenings of June 15, July 20, and August 16 as BUSY! Have a fun idea? Willing to help? Contact Katie Vaage.

As this congregation returns to in-person activities, and wrestles with the concept of hybrid church, it is imperative to have a focus, a vision. As your council, we want to focus on a unified vision of ministry. On Saturday June 25 from 9-12, we will be taking time to deliberate on and bring together the vision(s) of our future, facilitated by Steve Eulberg. We ask for your prayer support as we focus on the needs and ministries of this community of faith.
