Romans 3:19-28 (CEV)

¹⁹ We know that everything in the Law was written for those who are under its power. The Law says these things to stop anyone from making excuses and to let God show that the whole world is guilty. 20 God doesn't accept people simply because they obey the Law. No, indeed! All the Law does is to point out our sin. ²¹ Now we see how God does make us acceptable. The Law and the Prophets tell how we become acceptable, and it isn't by obeying the Law of Moses. 22 God treats everyone alike. God accepts people only because they have faith in Jesus Christ. ²³ All of us have sinned and fallen short of God's glory. ²⁴ But God treats us much better than we deserve, and because of Christ Jesus, God freely accepts us and sets us free from our sins. 25-26 God sent Christ to be our sacrifice. Christ offered his life's blood, so by faith in him we could come to God. And God did this to show that in the past he was right to be patient and forgive sinners. This also shows that God is right when he accepts people who have faith in Jesus. ²⁷ What is left for us to brag about? Not a thing! Is it because we obeyed some law? No! It is because of faith. ²⁸ We see that people are acceptable to God because they have faith, and not because they obey the Law.







Sept. 30th was National Day of Remembrance of Indigenous Boarding Schools,

Until 1970, the U.S. government's boarding school policies forcibly separated Native children from their families, placing them in abusive institutions in an attempt to destroy Native communities, languages, and cultures. At least 1,000 Native children died at over 500 schools across the country, with many buried in unmarked graves. In our Land Acknowledgement, each week we commit to learning more about and advocating for our indigenous siblings. Our Social Justice committee encourages you to ask our members of Congress to support the legislation known as the "Truth and Healing Commission on Indian Boarding School Policies Act." This landmark legislation would establish a federal commission to investigate, document, and acknowledge the historical harms of boarding schools
