GRANT OF RIGHT OF USE FEES

One Cubical Space In \$500
A Wall Niche

Two Cubical Spaces In \$1000
A Wall Niche

Four Cubical (Quad) Spaces \$2000
Purchased Together In
A Wall Niche

Fees include name, birth and death years, engraved on
niche granite cover. Engraving arrangements are the
responsibility of the Columbarium Memorial Garden Board
of Trustees.



USE REQUIREMENTS

Cremains shall be placed in a suitable container (urn) to be
deposited in the niche. The name and dates of birth and death
shall be marked on the outside and within the container.

Maximum urn size limits:

Rectangular: 6-1/2" L x 5-1/2" W x 11" High

Square: 5-1/2" L x 5-1/2" W x 11" High

Round: 5-1/2" Diameter x 11" High

At the time of purchase, the Buyer shall designate by name
the person(s) whose remains may be inurned.

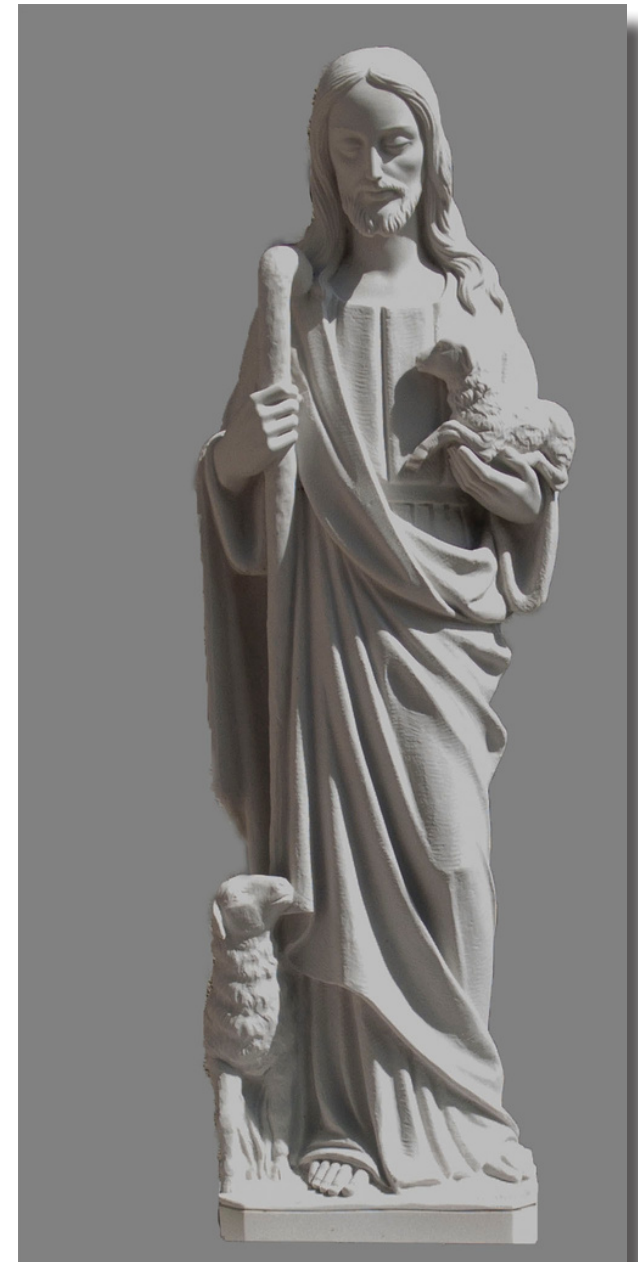
The names of those in the niches will be shown on the
individual niche cover. Engraving of the outer granite niche
cover will be the responsibility of the Columbarium Trustees.

Except with the written consent of King of Glory, Buyers'
rights may not be assigned, transferred or inherited, and
shall not be subject to claims of creditors. Buyers' rights
will not be assignable after the inurnment of the Buyer.

A religious service shall be held for each inurnment with
King of Glory clergy coordinating the service.

Flowers may be placed in the Columbarium Garden area,
using discretion and good taste. Their removal will be the
responsibility of the individuals who placed them for
commemoration.

Records of inurnment locations will be maintained by the
Columbarium Trustees in church archives.

As Christians celebrate Holy Communion on the Lord's Day, we are aware that we live in the midst of "angels and archangels and all the company of heaven," and experience the presence of Jesus Christ in Word and Sacrament. We also keep the departed faithful close in our hearts and memories at the Holy Table, where we offer the "sacrifice of thanksgiving" for all who have given us life. How appropriate, then, to have a Columbarium Memorial Garden at King of Glory close to the Holy Table where we offer the "sacrifice of thanksgiving" for those who have given us life.

The King of Glory Columbarium Memorial Garden is a quiet place of beauty and prayer—a visible reminder to the worshipping Body of Christ where the sacred remains of those we have loved in this life are lovingly kept and cared for.

King of Glory offers the Columbarium Memorial Garden for the disposition of the remains of those who have been cremated. Located adjacent to the worship sanctuary, the Columbarium Memorial Garden is enclosed and protected, but always available for friends and loved ones to visit.

The Columbarium Memorial Garden is planned for the inurnment of baptized current members of King of Glory, baptized ascendants, first generation descendants and spouses or unmarried partners. Inurnment may also be granted to previous members of King of Glory upon the recommendation of the Pastor in consultation with the Columbarium Memorial Garden Board of Trustees.

Cremains are kept in individual urns in wall enclosures, called niches. Urns are provided by the family, and must fit the size of the niche.

Applications for niche space can be obtained through the Church Office or by completing the request on the back of this brochure. Choice of niche location is based upon the date of receipt of a signed agreement.

The Columbarium Memorial Garden Board of Trustees are elected by the King of Glory congregation to serve a three-year term. Trustees have fiduciary responsibility for funds, maintain permanent records for archival purposes and oversee physical care and maintenance of the Columbarium Memorial Garden.
