¹⁸ Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. 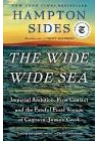

Email and voicemail are checked for emergencies regularly, even when the office is closed. Please contact our office if you have questions about how to recognize fraudulent emails.
